Recipes

Red Wine Mules

Ingredients

8 oz. red wine

2 oz. vodka

Juice of 1 lime

Ice

1 can ginger beer

2 lime rounds, for serving

Directions

Divide wine, vodka, and lime juice between two glasses. Top with ice and ginger beer. Garnish with lime round and serve.

Crockpot Mongolian Beef

Ingredients

1 ½ pounds beef flank steak, sliced thinly

½ cup cornstarch

2 tablespoons olive oil

½ teaspoon minced garlic

3/4 cup soya sauce (or gluten free tamari)

¾ cup water

¾ cup brown sugar

½ cup grated carrot

% cup sliced green onion (or scallions)

Directions

Coat flank steak pieces in cornstarch.

Add remainder of ingredients to the crockpot and stir well to combine
Place the flank steak into the crockpot and cook on high for 2-3 hours or on low for 4-5 hours
Add cooked greens (e.g., broccoli, spinach) as desired.

Serve over rice.

Freezing Directions

Coat flank steak in cornstarch.

Combine remaining ingredients and place into a 1 gallon freezer bag (or divide up)

Add steak to freezer bag(s)

Label and freeze

Cook as indicated above
